- Be prepared. Bring a pencil, agenda, interactive notebook, and homework every day.
- Beginning of class each day:
 - Enter room quietly, place phone in assigned slot, and go to your seat
 - Copy down that day's homework and leave agenda to be stamped
 - Copy and start the warm-up in your Interactive Notebook
